FRANK CORDELLE'S "CENTURY PROJECT" FEATURED AT HCC-SE'S FREE WOMEN'S CONFERENCE APRIL 4TH

Houston - The revealing, powerful and life-altering photos by photographer Frank Cordelle will be the opening event at Houston Community College Southeast's Women Studies Conference and Exhibit, taking place Tuesday through Friday, April 4 – 7, 2006, at the Eastside Campus.

Cordelle's critically acclaimed *Century Project*, which features chronologically displayed nude images of females from birth to 100 years of age along with personal narratives, will be unveiled April 4 in the Lecture Hall of the Angela Morales Bldg. of the Eastside Campus. **The exhibit is free and open to the public April 5 – 7.** It is being sponsored by Title V Faculty Leadership Program at HCC. 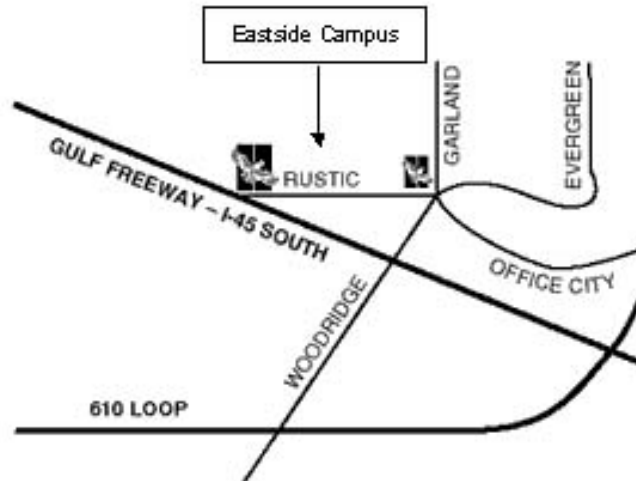

DIRECTIONS TO HCC SOUTHEAST



TO GET TO HOUSTON COMMUNITY COLLEGE SOUTHEAST FROM DOWNTOWN HOUSTON:

TAKE I-45 SOUTH to the WOODRIDGE EXIT. TURN LEFT AT THE LIGHT, GO UNDER THE FREEWAY AND TURN LEFT AT THE NEXT LIGHT AND FOLLOW ALONG THE FEEDER ROAD. WE ARE BEHIND JAMES CONEY ISLAND. TURN RIGHT AT RUSTIC.

HCC IS IN A 3-STORY, RED-ROOFED BUILDING. THE ANGELA MORALES BLDG. IS DIRECTLY BEHIND THE FIRST BUILDING. PARK IN THE CIRCULAR DRIVE IN THE FRONT AND WALK THROUGH TO THE ANGELA MORALES BUILDING.

THE LECTURE HALL IS PAST THE INFORMATION DESK ON THE RIGHT SIDE.
